ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted).

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition, including a maximum of 2 graded classes. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

A class will be won by the dog that has completed the course in the fastest time with the least number of faults, unless otherwise stated for special classes.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.d refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 - Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. *N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 - Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3 - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5 - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2,3,4,6 or 7

Grade 6 - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2,3,4,5 or 7.

Grade 7 - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Championship Class (Kennel Club Championship Agility Certificate)

Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7 which have had five wins at Full Height in either Grade 6 or Grade 7, at least three of which must be gained in agility classes. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class, and a final round of Agility, to be held at the same Show.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Special Helter Skelter (Class 43 & 44)

A flowing course based on a circular design containing jumps and tunnels only. Open to dogs running at their measured height. Standard marking will apply. Results for large & intermediate will be combined, and medium & small will be combined.

Special Tunnel Exchange (Class 41 & 42)

Open to all grades, one dog with 2 handlers. A dog can only be entered once in this class. Results for large & intermediate will be combined, and medium & small will be combined.

This class will contain jumps and tunnels only. Handlers change over half way through the course at the exit of a tunnel.

Special Anysize & Veteran Jumping & Tunnel Exchange (Class 45, 46, 92, 93, 47)

Dogs entered for these classes may not be entered in any other classes at the show.
Veteran dogs must be 9 years or over on the day of the show.

Large and intermediate dogs will jump medium height (400 mm), medium dogs will jump small height (300 mm) and small dogs will jump 200 mm height.

Jumping - A course with jumps and tunnels only.

Tunnel Exchange - A course with jumps and tunnels only. One dog with 2 handlers. A dog can only be entered once in this class. Handlers change over half way through the course at the exit of a tunnel.

Special Speedstakes (Class 92 & 93)

This is a Jumping course that also includes an A-frame.

The Speedstakes class must include 12 (twelve) weave poles and an A-frame, both of which may be taken up to 2 (two) times each. The Speedstakes class will not include the dogwalk or seesaw.

Woodside Games Challenge - Sponsored by Glenndarcy

There will be 2 separate class height Games Challenge winners
(Large/Intermediate and Small/Medium)

The Games Challenge event will consist of the Special Gamblers (Classes 88 & 89) and the Special Snooker (Classes 90 & 91). These will be run as separate special classes with individual awards.

Combined placing results of the two special classes will determine the Woodside Games Challenge Winners. In the event of a tie, points from gamblers be used as the tie breaker then, if still a tie, the quickest time from gamblers will be used.

Class 88 - Special Large & Intermediate Gamblers

Open to large and intermediate running at their measured height

The goal of Gamblers is to accumulate as many points as possible within the time allotted by the judge, and then to make a strategic decision to perform, or not, the short "gamble" sequence(s) within a specified time period to earn bonus points. The competitor who earns the most points wins. The Gamblers course is set up with the obstacles placed

randomly around the ring, without specific flow. Each obstacle is assigned a points value as follows –

- 1 point Jumps
- 2 points Tunnel, Tyre, Long Jump, Spread, Wall
- 3 points Seesaw
- 4 points A-frame
- 5 points Dogwalk, 12 weave poles

A handler earns points by successfully completing the obstacle. An obstacle can be performed only twice for points but not in succession. There is no penalty for taking the obstacle additional times during the opening period (unless the judge deems it is loitering for the gamble, but no points will be awarded).

Obstacles that are one-directional (i.e. seesaw, spread, and long jump) must be taken in the correct direction to earn points.

The Gamblers run consists of two parts: an opening period and a gamble period. The first part is the opening period, which has a designated course time. Handlers accumulate points by successfully performing obstacles of their choice during this time period. During the gamble period, handlers will have a specified amount of time to complete a gamble sequence gaining bonus points. The time allotted for the gamble period shall be determined by the judge. The gamble points shall be awarded if the dog completes the chosen sequence without faults within the specified time.

Points shall determine the placement of the dogs. The run ends when the dog takes the finish jump and stops time. Time is a tiebreaker only. The handler may decide not to do the gamble.

Class 89 - Special Medium & Small Gamblers

Open to small and medium dogs running at their measured height. Rules are as per above for Special Large & Intermediate Gamblers

Class 90 - Special Large & Intermediate Snooker

Open to intermediate and large dogs running at their measured height.

The object of the game snooker is to score as many points within the maximum course time set by the judge. The scoring is similar to the game of snooker. However, the judge may place the obstacles in the ring in any way.

The judge will design a course consisting of red jumps and a sequence to represent each of the other snooker colours: yellow (2 points), green (3 points), brown (4 points), blue (5 points), pink (6 points) and black (7 points).

Each run is in two parts. The first part, allows the dog and handler to collect as many points as possible by successfully completing each red jump (1 point) followed by any coloured sequence. The maximum number of points available in the opening part is 24: 1+7+1+7+1+7. The second part, requires the dog and handler to complete the coloured obstacles (2 through to 7) in sequential order before the course time has elapsed for a maximum of 27 points.

Snooker course will be run as follows:

- Start jump
- Red jump 1, any coloured sequence,
- Red jump 1 (different from first red), any coloured sequence,
- Red jump 1 (different from first and second red), any coloured sequence,
- Coloured sequences are yellow 2, green 3, brown 4, blue 5, pink 6, black 7,
- Finish jump

Class 91 - Special Medium & Small Snooker

Open to medium and small dogs running at their measured height. Rules are as per above for Special Intermediate & Large Snooker.

QUALIFIERS

This is an agility competition, which is open to Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large dogs in Grades 1 to 2. The qualifying heats and final will be judged under standard Kennel Club rules and regulations. The class can be either combined or graded 1 to 2. When the heat is a graded class, the results will be combined to identify who has qualified for the final. Any subsequent grade changes will not alter a dog's eligibility to compete in the final. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat, and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final, further heats may be entered by competitors, and any placings will not affect the dog's eligibility to run in the final. The handler that qualifies the dog for the final will be the handler that competes in the final. The handler that qualifies the dog for the final will be the handler that competes in the final. A dog cannot qualify more than once, with a different handler.

The top 2 dogs from Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large will be invited to take part in the final. In the event that those placed 1st or 2nd have already qualified, the next partnership which has not qualified will be invited to the final in July. In the event of a show that is due to hold a qualifier be cancelled, Granite City DAC may invite lower placed competitors to attend the Final as required.

The final will be an agility round, and will be held at Granite City DAC Show on Saturday 18th July 2026, after the rings have finished for the day.

It is the responsibility of participants to familiarise themselves with the rules on the Granite City DAC website. Granite City DAC - Show/Events (gcdac.co.uk)

Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2026

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. Qualifiers compete in a finals of which the winners are awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).
2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows: 1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point
3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.
4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete

in the final with more than one dog.

5. The finals in 2026 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify.
6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland.
7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.
8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.

Heat Rules

Each heat will take place at six KC Open, Premier or Championship shows held in Scotland. Heats will take the form of a graded or combined 6-7 agility class, held under standard KC rules and regulations. There will be a class at each show holding heats for all four heights of dogs – Large, Intermediate, Medium and Small.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in any heat and may qualify more than one dog in the final. A dog that has already qualified can be entered in further heats.

Qualification and the finals

The first two previously unqualified dogs in each height category from each of the heat will go through to the finals. Where results in the heat are graded the results will be combined for the purpose of qualification. If a dog that has already qualified is in the first two then the qualification will move down to the highest placed dog.

The winners of last year's CSJ Highland Finals have already pre-qualified for the 2025 finals.

Competitors may qualify more than one dog in the finals. The team (handler and dog) that qualify cannot be changed for either the preliminary round or the final

This year's final will take place at **Prestwick Dog Agility Club Show on Saturday 6th June 2026 after show closes**. This will consist of a preliminary round and the final. Each will be an agility class judged according to KC rules and regulations.

Finalists will be sent invitations in advance of the event with further details.

Showtime Dual Challenge

This is a points-based competition.

Points will be awarded throughout the year to both competitors and their allocated clubs/training group. The event will be open to dogs of all grades and heights. The results for each class will be awarded points from 10 for first down to 1 for tenth (if there are 10 non eliminations).

At the end of the season awards will be made based on the 4 heights plus an award to the club/training group that has amassed the most points overall.

Please be sure to name your club or training group on your Showtime account when entering the show.



All dogs must be kept on the lead at all times when on the showground, including day parking and overflow camping areas, unless they are competing or in the designated exercise area. Only 2 dogs per handler off lead in exercise area.

Dogs in vehicles on hot days Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1) **ENTRY CONDITIONS.** Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number or authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
- 2) **OVERSEAS ENTRIES.** All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3) **FEES.** Amount of entry per dog per class £4.75 (Free for WDAC working members - each member will have max. of two dogs' entries free each day). Championship Classes £20.00 for Championship classes. (£10.00 Working WDAC members). There is no charge for NFC entry.
- 4) **PRIZE MONEY.** There will be no prize money at this show.
- 5) **INTERNET ENTRIES** may be made via www.showtime-online.co.uk.
- 6) **REFUSAL OF ENTRIES.** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 7) **PUPPIES.** Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- 8) A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
- 9) **NFC.** Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 12 weeks and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form. There will be no entry fee for NFC dogs.
- 10) **BITCHES IN SEASON.** A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
- 11) The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
- 12) **TREATMENT OF DOGS.** No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 13) **COLLARS.** Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or leads when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
- 14) **APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES.** Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserve the right to appoint another judge.
- 15) **JUDGES DECISION.** No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 16) **SPONSORSHIP.** Sponsorship for this show has kindly been received from The Royal Kennel Club, CSJ, Millie's Paws, Hannah Paterson Photography, Glenndarcy
- 17) **QUALIFIERS** - Refer to detailed rules given in above in schedule.
- 18) **MARKING** - Kennel Club Standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
- 19) **EQUIPMENT HEIGHTS** - The height of jump obstacles for Large dogs will be 600mm, Intermediate dogs 500mm, Medium dogs 400 mm and Small dogs 300mm in all standard and special classes except Special Veterans and Special Any-size Classes. These classes will be as detailed in "Special Classes" section above- Large and Intermediate dogs 400 mm; Medium dogs 300 mm; Small dogs 200 mm
- 20) **HEIGHT LIMIT FOR DOGS.** Large Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers.
Intermediate Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers
Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and 430mm or under at the withers.
Small Dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers
- 21) **JUDGES.** A judge at an Agility Show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 22) **REMOVAL OF DOGS FROM COMPETITION.** Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be withdrawn from competition prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season. (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
- 23) **Removal of competitors:**
No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Kennel Club in the Incident Book
- 24) Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
- 25) **ELIGIBILITY.** In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 18 days before the start of the competition (i.e. 14th April 2026 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. If a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show after the entry form to that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the corresponding number of class available for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding classes number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade, the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 26) **CHANGES TO ARRANGEMENTS.** Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 27) **CANCELLATION.** In the event that the show has to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, Woodside DAC will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event Woodside DAC will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- 28) **CARRYING IN HAND** Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
- 29) No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
- 30) No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area
- 31) The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
- 32) **RERUNS** Should the judge deem a rerun is required, any results and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
- 33) **ENTRY FORMS** Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. It is the responsibility of the owner / competitor to ensure that the entry form is filled out correctly. No refunds will be given in the case of incorrectly completed entry forms being submitted.
- 34) **FREE PASSES** Not Applicable

- 35) COMPETITION OF DOGS SUFFERING FROM CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
- 36) CLASSES It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club. In Championship classes competitors must run in exact running order as specified in the Regulations.
- 37) An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
- 38) ANIMALS IN EVENT No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 39) PAY ON THE DAY. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
- 40) PRACTICE RING A practice ring may be available for dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge..
- 41) WELFARE OF DOGS A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.. **The use of pinch collars, electric shock collars or prong collars is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.**
- 42) LOSS OR DAMAGES. WDAC will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or whatsoever to person, dogs or property at this show.
- 43) CLOSING CLASSES Dogs will not be received for competition after a class has been declared closed

DOG MEASURING

All dogs require to have been officially measured before competing at a RKC licensed show. Dogs must be a minimum of 15 months before being measured. A second measurement must be carried out on the dog between 12 and 24 months after the first. Please have your Agility Warrant book available for inspection at the show, if required.

Measuring at the show will be carried out by Amanda Smith and Lesley McEwan. Details will be given on our Show FB page on the run up to the show.

Camping

Camping is limited and is on a first come first served basis. For alternative sites in the area contact Biggar Tourist Centre on 01899 221 066.

If your camping request is not accepted and you would also like your show entry returned, please ensure you tick the boxes on both the entry form and the camping form indicating your wish. If you do not tick the box it will be assumed that you still wish to enter the show even if your request to camp on-site has been unsuccessful. Camping fees will be returned if you are not granted camping.

- Camping is available Friday & Saturday nights only
- Camping is available from 14:00 hours on Friday of Show. You must not arrive before this time as pitches will not be available. There is no waiting area in the show ground.
- No arrivals after 22:00 hours. No overnight parking available.
- Camping charges are **£20** for weekend.
- All camping pitches must be pre-booked.
- A fire bucket must be situated outside each unit.
- Use of generators is strictly limited. No generators are to be used after 21:00 hours and before 08:00 hours. Generators are not allowed in units adjacent to the rings
- Vehicles must be parked as directed or you may be asked to move. You must keep all tents, vehicles etc within your marked pitch.
- Camping pitches are not transferable. If you are unable to use your pitch, and camping is full, you must notify us by messaging the show FB page or emailing woodsidemayshow@gmail.com. We shall then reallocate the pitch to the next person on the waiting list. Your camping fee will be refunded, providing the pitch is reallocated.

Judges and Scribes will be allocated free camping. Please tick the appropriate box on the entry

Directions to the venue (What3words – reclaimed.roadblock.cable)

From the south and west.

Leave the M74 at JUNCTION 13 (ABINGDON SERVICES). Take the A702, signposted for BIGGAR / EDINBURGH / LANARK. Follow this for 1 mile then bear right, signposted for BIGGAR / EDINBURGH. Continue on the A702 for 10 miles passing through the villages of LAMINGTON, COULTER and CAUSWAYEND. On entering the town of BIGGAR continue on the A702, through the town centre, signposted for EDINBURGH / PEEBLES. As you leave the town, the entrance to the venue is on the right, through large red gates, 150 yards past the national speed limit signs.

From the north and east.

From the A720 (EDINBURGH CITY BYPASS) take the LOTHIANBURN JUNCTION signposted CITY CENTRE / CARLISLE. Follow the directions at the junction for CARLISLE A702. After ½ mile, bear right at the 3-way fork in the road, following the signs for CARLISLE A702. Continue on the A702 for 23 miles, through the villages of SILVERBURN,

CARLOPS, WEST LINTON and DOLPHINTON. Just before entering the town of BIGGAR, the entrance to the venue is on the left, through large red gates, between the 200-yard and 100-yard marker signs for the start of the 30MPH speed limit.

Please note there is a 5mph speed limit in place at the venue. This is in place for the safety of all those on site. Those exceeding the speed limit may be asked to leave the venue.
