Eligibility of Classes:

In the following definitions of classes, First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the weaving poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

A maximum of 4 standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition **including a maximum of 2 graded classes**. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure - A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

A Class will be won by the dog that has completed the course in the fastest time with the least number of faults, unless otherwise stated for special classes.

Progression - Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression, wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression - At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

Standard Classes

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1: Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2: Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes) or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Special Classes:

Special Veteran Jumping - Dogs must be over 7 years old and not entered in any other class at the show except Special Any Size Jumping and/or Special Any Size Helter-Skelter. The course will consist of jumps and tunnels only. Handlers may choose what height their dog jumps at on the day (Micro to Large). All handlers will walk the course at the same height. The results will be combined Large/ Intermediate and combined Medium/Small.

Special Any Size Jumping - Dogs must be over 18 months old and not entered in any other class at the show, except Special Veteran Jumping (if eligible) or Special Any Size Helter Skelter. The course will consist of jumps and tunnels only. Handlers may choose what height their dog jumps at on the day (Micro to Large). All handlers will walk the course at the same height. The results will be combined Large/ Intermediate and combined Medium/Small.

Special Any size Helter-Skelter - Dogs must be over 18 months old and not entered in any other class at the show, except Special Veteran Jumping (if eligible) and /or Special Any size jumping. A flowing course based on a circular design containing jumps and tunnels only. Handlers may choose what height their dog jumps at on the day (Micro to Large). All handlers will walk the course at the same height. The results will be combined Large/ Intermediate and combined Medium/Small.

Special Juniors Combined Agility and Jumping - These classes are open to handlers under 19 years on the day of the class. Large, Intermediate, Medium & Small dogs are eligible for the class. Equipment specifications will be as set for standard classes. Dogs will run in their standard measured height category. The results will be split by height category and trophies/rosettes awarded as set in standard classes. Handlers are not limited to the number of dogs they can enter in these classes; however a dog may only be entered in one junior class per day.

Showtime Dual Challenge (SDC):

This is a points-based competition. Points will be awarded throughout the year to both competitors and their allocated clubs/training group. The event will be open to dogs of all grades and heights. The results for each class will be awarded points from 10 for first down to 1 for tenth (if there are 10 non-eliminations). At the end of the season awards will be made based on the 4 heights plus an award to the club/training group that has amassed the most points overall. Please be sure to name your club or training group on your Showtime account when entering the show.



Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2026 - Qualifier

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. Qualifiers compete in a final of which the winners are awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).
2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows: 1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point.
3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.
4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.
5. The finals in 2026 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify.
6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland.
7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.
8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.

Dog Measuring: Please note that ALL DOGS (Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large) require to have been officially measured before competing at a K.C. licensed show. Dogs must be a minimum of 15 months before being measured. A second measurement must be carried out on the dog between 12 and 24 months after the first. Please have your Agility Warrant book available for inspection at the show, if required. Measuring will take place at this show. Time to be confirmed.

Rosettes: Rosettes awarded for a minimum of 10% of entries in all classes.

Awards: A trophy will be given for 1st place in all classes.

Rules & Regulations:

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry £5.50 (ADAC Working Members - Free) Dogs entered NFC no charge. Facilities Charge £1.90 per account holder per day.
4. No prize money is offered at this show.
5. Online entries only via www.Showtime-online.co.uk
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete more than once in a class, including special classes.
9. Capping - NA.
10. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
11. A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarterfinals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
12. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
13. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
14. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close-fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
15. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. Sponsorship. No classes at this show are sponsored.
18. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The height of jump obstacles for Large dogs will be 600mm in all relevant classes.
The height of jump obstacles for Intermediate dogs will be 500mm in all relevant classes.
The height of jump obstacles for Medium dogs will be 400mm in all relevant classes.
The height of jump obstacles for Small dogs will be 300 mm in all relevant classes.
In the special Veteran and Any size classes (classes 49, 50, 101, 102) the course will consist of jumps and tunnels only. Large and Intermediate dogs will compete with jumps set at medium height, Medium dogs at small height and Small dogs at micro height (400mm, 300mm and 250 mm respectively).
20. The Height limits for dogs:-
 - a. Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers.
 - b. Intermediate Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.
 - c. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers.
 - d. Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from Competition. Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from an Agility Show if it is:-
 - a. A Bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.

23. Removal of competitors: No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in the removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Kennel Club in the Incident book.
24. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 18 days before the start of the competition i.e. 12th May shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Royal Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
30. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area.
31. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
32. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
33. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Owner and must be signed by the Owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
34. Free Passes - NA.
35. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
37. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
38. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
39. A pay on the day class may be held if time permits.
40. A practice ring may be available if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
41. Welfare of Dogs - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electric shock collars or prong collars is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
42. A briefing of competitors will be held prior to the start of each class.
43. All competitors and dogs enter at their own risk. No responsibility will be accepted for loss, damage or whatsoever to persons, dogs or property at this show.

Show Specific Rules

Please observe the following or you may be asked to leave the show

1. **There is a strict 5mph speed limit within the venue**
2. Do not leave dogs unattended at the ring side.
3. Please respect this venue and the surrounding area
4. Clean up after your dog and dispose of all waste in bins provided
5. Please keep valuables under lock and key as the Club is not responsible for loss or damage.

Catering

Darcy's catering van will be on-site throughout the show.

Camping and Parking

Due to the limited space available the holding of spaces will be strictly limited to one place.

Camping

1. Please request camping on entry form. Camping limited to one unit per entry.
2. Camping Charge: £22.00 per unit. Avon Club working members: Free
3. Camping available from **2 pm** on Friday 29th May 2026 until Sunday 31st May 2026
No arrivals will be accepted before this time.
4. Camping area must be vacated at the end of the show.
5. No portable type barbecues or open fires allowed.
6. All units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and first aid facilities (Kennel Club Health & Safety Guidelines annex A" G) and have a bucket of water sited outside, at the front of the unit.
7. Dogs must be kept on a lead in the camping area.
8. Further Guidelines may be issued on arrival at camping area.

Parking

Day visitors shall park in the designated area and not in the camping area.
