PRIZES:

Trophies: To at least 1st place in all classes.

Rosettes: To at least 10% in all classes.

Rosettes for clear rounds in Grade 1 & 2 classes, collect on the day from the Marquee/Secretary's office.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes 1st prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed championship agility, premier agility, open agility or limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted).

Standard classes may be scheduled for agility shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the weaving poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of 4 standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition **including a maximum of 2 graded classes**. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for a maximum of 3 consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

A class will be won by the dog that has completed the course in the fastest time with the least number of faults, unless otherwise stated for special classes.

Progression. Progression from each grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at small, medium, intermediate or large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.d refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only 1st prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the 2 wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. *N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three 1st places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five 1st places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as “special classes”. The eligibility for “special” classes must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word “special” must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Special Helter Skelter – A flowing course based on a circular design containing jumps and tunnels only.

Special Veteran Jumping Classes – Open to dogs aged 8 years and over on the day of competition. Dogs may not be entered in any other classes at the show, apart from the Anysize jumping classes. The jumps will be set at Medium, small and micro with handlers choosing the height they wish their dog to jump on the day. This class will not contain weaves, tyre or long jump.

Special Anysize Jumping Classes- Open to any dogs not entered in any standard Kennel Club classes at this show. Dogs may not be entered in any other classes at the show, apart from Veterans (if eligible). The jumps will be set at Medium, small and micro with handlers choosing the height they wish their dog to jump on the day.. This class will not contain weaves, tyre or long jump.

Special Juniors - Open to handlers aged under 18 years pf age on day of the show. Handlers limited to running 3 dogs, they do not have to be family dogs.

QUALIFIERS

Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2026 - Qualifier



1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. Qualifiers compete in a finals of which the winners are awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).

2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows: 1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point

3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.

4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.

5. The finals in 2026 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify.

6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland.

7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.

8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.



Granite City **Thistle Cup**

Regulations 2026

This is an agility competition, which is open to Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large dogs in Grades 1 to 2. The qualifying heats and final will be judged under standard Kennel Club rules and regulations. The class can be either combined or graded 1 to 2. When the heat is a graded class, the results will be combined to identify who has qualified for the final. Any subsequent grade changes will not alter a dog's eligibility to compete in the final. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat, and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final, further heats may be entered by competitors, and any placings will not affect the dog's eligibility to run in the final. The handler that qualifies the dog for the final will be the handler that competes in the final. The handler that qualifies the dog for the final will be the handler that competes in the final. A dog cannot qualify more than once, with a different handler.

The top 2 dogs from Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large will be invited to take part in the final. In the event that those placed 1st or 2nd have already qualified, the next partnership which has not qualified will be invited to the final in July.

In the event of a show that is due to hold a qualifier be cancelled, Granite City DAC may invite lower placed competitors to attend the Final as required.

The final will be an agility round, and will be held at Granite City DAC Show on Saturday 18th July 2026, after the rings have finished for the day.

It is the responsibility of participants to familiarise themselves with the rules on the Granite City DAC website.

The Showtime Novice Cup **Regulations 2026**

This is an agility competition for Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large dogs and will be judged under standard Kennel Club rules and regulations. It will be classified as combined or graded 3, 4 and 5. Where the heat is graded the results will be combined for qualification to the finals. Any subsequent grade change will not alter a dog's eligibility to compete in the Final.

There will be 6 heats, the first three from each heat will go forward to the Finals.

The Finals will be split into two parts. The Medium and Large Finals will be held at Dundee Championship Show in August. The Small and Intermediate Finals will be held at Gleniffer Championship Show in September. All finals will take place after the close of show. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Final, further heats may be entered for competition, but any placings will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final. The handler that qualifies a dog for the Final will be the handler that competes in the Final.

Heats – All heights will have a trophy for first place and rosettes 1st to 6th.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed agility shows must be registered at The Royal Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry Fees:- £4.75 per dog per class, (entries are free for TDTC members working at the show)
4. There will be no prize money at this show)
5. Internet entries may be made via www.showtime-online.co.uk.
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 12 weeks and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.

15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. Granite City Thistle Cup is sponsored by Millie's Paws & Hannah Paterson Photography.
17. Qualifiers – please refer to detailed rules given above in this schedule.
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The height of jump obstacles for Special Junior and Helter Skelter classes will be Large dogs 600 mm, Intermediate dogs 500 mm, Medium dogs 400 mm and Small dogs 300 mm. For any size and veteran special classes handlers can choose the height at which the dog jumps and the heights will be 400 mm, 300 mm and 200 mm.
20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large dog classes - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - b. Intermediate dog classes – For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - c. Medium dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - d. Small dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
21. Judges at an agility show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-

 - a. A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to The Royal Kennel Club.

23. Removal of competitors:

No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Royal Kennel Club in the Incident Book.
24. Dog agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including **18** days before the start of the competition, 2 June 2026, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to The Royal Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all

those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.

28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
30. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area.
31. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
32. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
33. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
34. Not used
35. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to The Royal Kennel Club. In championship classes competitors must run in exact running order specified in the regulations.
37. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
38. Animals in Event
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board.

However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
39. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
40. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
41. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any agility show licensed by The Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
42. Photography and filming: The taking of photographs and films at the show for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the permission of the show organisers. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show provided they are for private use only and not for reward.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - PLEASE READ!!!

ALL KENNEL CLUB REGULATIONS APPLY WITHIN THE BOUNDARY OF THE SHOW:- THIS INCLUDES ALL AREAS WITHIN THE SHOWGROUND, I.E CAMPING AREA, DAY PARKING, COMPETITION RINGS AND EXERCISE AREA.

Dogs MUST be kept on lead at all times except when competing and in the exercise area. This is from Friday 19 June to Sunday 21 June 2026.

CAMPING INFORMATION

Camping is available Friday and Saturday night – Fee £22.00. Please book and pay with entry.

Access to the venue will be available from **Friday afternoon FROM 3pm (1pm if you are a helper in any way).**
All units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and first aid facilities (Kennel Club Health & Safety Guidelines annex A" G) and have a bucket of water sited outside, at the front of the unit.

Dogs are to be kept on lead in the car park and camping areas at all times.

PARKING:- Day visitors should park in the designated area . The front row will be reserved for those helping on the day.
Dog exercise area will be marked out and bins for dog waste are provided. **PLEASE RESPECT THIS VENUE AND CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG(S) AT ALL TIMES.**

Please ensure that dogs are **NOT** left unattended.

Dogs in cars on hot days: Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be a fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. At the show, your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures. Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade e.g. a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Directions from the West: From the West follow A721 until it joins A72 to Peebles, stay on this road until The Nest Roundabout, take A707 for Selkirk, in town centre take A7 signposted for Hawick and Carlisle. Just on the outskirts of Selkirk take A699 to Kelso, follow this through St Boswells and Maxton *and in approx 5 miles you'll reach a narrow stone bridge, turn left past entrance to Springwood Park Caravan Site, Showground is on your right, keep going until you see the Main Entrance Gates.

Directions from M6: Turn off on to A7 at Carlisle and stay on A7 until Hawick. At Hawick take A698 for Kelso until it joins A68. Turn left for Edinburgh until St Boswells. Turn immediately right on to A699 through Maxton for Kelso. Follow directions from * above.

From the South on the A1: Take A697 just after Morpeth from Coldstream. At Cornhill on Tweed take B6350 (opposite the Collingwood Arms Hotel) for Wark. Stay on this road all the way in to Kelso, at the 'T' junction turn right (on to B6352) and then straight on at the next junction. The Showground is on the left at the bottom of the hill.

From the South on the A68 Pass through Jedburgh and at the fork take A698 to Kelso. Stay on A698 until the Sainsbury's Roundabout and take the 1st left (B6352 to Town Centre), follow this road to the bottom of the hill then branch left and the Showground is on your left.

From the North: From Edinburgh, take A68 Jedburgh road. At St. Boswells take A699 through Maxton (2nd road for Kelso 400 yards beyond The Buccleuch Arms Hotel). Follow directions from * above.
