ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes 1st prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed championship agility, premier agility, open agility or limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for agility shows, as agility classes or jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the weaving poles obstacle. Standard agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", dog walk and see-saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

A class will be won by the dog that has completed the course in the fastest time with the least number of faults, unless otherwise stated for special classes.

Progression. Progression from each grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at small, medium, intermediate, or large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

Standard Classes

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from grade 2 and are not eligible for grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from grade 3 and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as “special classes”. The eligibility for “special” classes must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word “special” must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles the A-ramp, and the dog walk and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places, and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Measuring of Dogs - Competitors are reminded that all dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show. Record books or proof of measurement must be available on request.

Special Helter-Skelter – A flowing course based on a circular design containing jumps and tunnels only.

Special Junior Jumping – U12 open to handlers under 12 years of age on the day of the show. O12 open to handlers aged 12 and up to 18 years of age on the day of the show. There is no limit to the number of dogs a junior can run in this class, and they do not have to be family dogs.



Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2027

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. The final will be held at the SKC August Show each year with the winners in each height category being awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).
2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows:
1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point
3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.
4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.
5. The finals in 2027 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify. The finals for the SADOTY 2027 will be held as part of SKC's August Agility Show. To be awarded the title of Scottish Agility Dog the Year the dog must be clear within the course time in the finals.
6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland. For SADOTY 2027, heats must be held between July 2026 and July 2027.
7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.
8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.

Heat Rules

Each heat will take place at six KC Open, Premier or Championship shows held in Scotland.

Heats will take the form of a graded or combined 6-7 agility class, held under standard KC rules and regulations. There will be a class at each show holding heats for all four heights of dogs – Large, Intermediate, Medium and Small.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in any heat and may qualify more than one dog in the final. A dog that has already qualified can be entered in further heats.

Qualification and the finals

The first two previously unqualified dogs in each height category from each of the heat will go through to the finals at the Game Fair. Where results in the heat are graded the results will be combined for the purpose of qualification. If a dog that has already qualified is in the first two then the qualification will move down to the highest placed dog.

The winners of last year's CSJ Highland Finals have already pre-qualified for the 2027 finals.

Competitors may qualify more than one dog in the finals. The team (handler and dog) that qualify cannot be changed for the final

This 2027 final will take place at Prestwick and District DTC Show in June 2027 at Rozelle. The final will be an agility class judged according to KC rules and regulations.

Finalists will be sent invitations in advance of the event with further details.

Rules & Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed agility shows must be registered at The Royal Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry Fees £5.25 per dog per class. There is no fee for N.F.C
4. No Prize Money.
5. Internet entries, online via www.Showtime-online.co.uk.
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 12 weeks and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. Sponsors: Skinners, CSJ
17. KC Qualifiers -Not Applicable.
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. Special Classes – Not Applicable
20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large dog classes - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - b. Intermediate dog classes – For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - c. Medium dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - d. Small dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable)
21. Judges at an agility show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-

A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi finals and finals of the Kennel Club Prestige Events

 1. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 2. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 3. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 4. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show incident book and submitted to The Royal Kennel Club.
23. No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Royal Kennel Club in the Incident Book.
24. Dog agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 18 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 6th October 2026, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show 10th October 2026. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to The Royal Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be carried in the hand or

given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.

29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.

30. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area.

31. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.

32. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.

33. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.

34. (Where applicable) Free Passes – All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued. (State if applicable that additional free passes may be issued at the organising Committee's discretion).

35. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.

36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to The Royal Kennel Club. In championship classes competitors must run in exact running order specified in the regulations.

37. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.

38. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

39. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.

40. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.

41. An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any agility show licensed by The Royal Kennel Club. This will apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.

42. Refunds are not available after the entries have closed.

Directions

From North (M90) After Forth Road Bridge, immediately branch left, keep to RH lane. At traffic lights/roundabout take 3rd exit onto the A904 (signposted Bo'ness and Stirling). Continue on this road until T junction with B8046 (Broxburn B8046, Stirling (M9)), Turn left here onto B8046. Stay on B8046 for approx. 1.5 miles, Turn right onto B9080, taking immediate left, back onto B8046 for approx. 1.5 miles. After the dip into Ecclesmachan, turn right (looks like housing estate) signposted Oatridge Agricultural College, then turn left away from houses. Remain on this road past all college buildings -venue straight ahead. Please adhere to speed limits.

From West (M8) Leave M8 at Junction 3 (Livingston), at roundabout take the 4th exit onto the A899 (signposted Bathgate and Broxburn). At next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A899 (signposted Dechmont, Uphall and Broxburn). At next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A899 (signposted Uphall and Broxburn). At next roundabout take the 1st exit (signposted Broxburn). In Uphall at traffic lights turn left onto Ecclesmachan Road - B8046 (signposted Linlithgow). Approx. 2 miles to Ecclesmachan. After the dip into Ecclesmachan, turn left (looks like housing estate) signposted Oatridge Agricultural College. Remain on this road past all college buildings - venue straight ahead. Please adhere to speed limits.

From West (M9) Leave M9 at Junction 2. Turn right onto B8046 (Uphall) for approx. 1.5 miles, Turn right onto B9080 taking immediate left back onto B8046 for approx. 1.5 miles. After the dip into Ecclesmachan, turn right (looks like housing estate) signposted Oatridge Agricultural College, then turn left away from houses. Remain on this road past all college buildings - venue straight ahead. Please adhere to speed limits.

From South (M8) Take A720 (City Bypass). Branch left then at roundabout take the 1st exit onto the M8 (signposted Glasgow, Forth Road Bridge, A90, Stirling, Livingston, M8, M9). Leave M8 at junction 3. At roundabout take the 4th exit onto the A899 (signposted Bathgate and Broxburn). At next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A899 (signposted Dechmont). At next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A899 (signposted Uphall and Broxburn). At next roundabout take the 1st exit (signposted Broxburn). In Uphall, at traffic lights turn left onto Ecclesmachan Road - B8046 (signposted Linlithgow). Approx. 2 miles to Ecclesmachan. Turn left (looks like housing estate) signposted Oatridge Agricultural College. Remain on this road past all college buildings - venue straight ahead. Please adhere to speed limits. **From East (as from South)**
